- NAVY SAVINGS DEPOSIT PROGRAM:
During this cruise all hands will be eligible for the Navy Savings Deposit Program. Here are the facts you should know:
 - All savings earn 10% interest compounded quarterly on the average amount on deposit during the quarter.
 - Deposits are made automatically by using a "J" allotment. This allotment runs for at least three months.
 - Once deposited money may not be withdrawn except under emergency conditions with the permission of the Commanding Officer.
 - Allotments will be stopped automatically upon arrival to the US. All money deposited and the interest thereon will be returned automatically by check 90 days after arrival to the U.S. Interest will still accrue for this 90 day period.
 - Members desiring to start "J" allotments commencing as of 1 September 1967 can register allotments in the Disbursing Office between 21 and 31 August 1967.

1. The following notes are taken from COMSIXTHFLT Regulations:

A. MARRIAGES - Personnel attached to SIXTH FLEET units shall not enter into marriage without the prior approval of the Commanding Officer and COMSIXTHFLT.


B. CIGARETTES. - Personnel from ships visiting Naples shall not land more than one opened package of seastore cigarettes at any one time. In ports other than Naples personnel shall not land more than two packages of cigarettes per day.



2. Briefing on ROTA, PART I

1. General Information. The Navy Base of ROTA / Spanish title as used
in the U.S. - Spanish Base agreement / is a joint Spanish American base
over which flies the Spanish flag. Groundwork for the mutual defense
agreements and base construction program was laid by ADM. Forrest B.
SHERMAN in discussions with GENERALISSIMO FRANCO in 1951. Agreements
signed in 1953 by the U.S. and Spanish governments provide for an
initial ten year lease on the base sites, subject to two five year
extensions. Major components of the base include U.S. Naval Station
with Naval Air Facilities, Port Facilities, Magazine Area, U.S. Naval
Communications Station, Spain, homeported and rotational Aviation Fleet
Squadrons, Fleet Weather Central, Rota, Marine Barracks, Rota, Navy
Overseas Air Cargo Terminal, U.S. Naval Fuel Depot, Rota, and Terminal
storage, and a POL pier Port Terminus serving a multi-product pipeline
system to Air Force Bases in the Spanish interior. COMSUBRON 16 is
homeported at ROTA as well as a submarine tender / AS/ and floating
dry dock / ARDM/. The harbor and air field are joint use facilities
for U.S. and Spanish forces.

Although the U.S. activities at Rota are under U.S. control, the area
encompassing the Naval Base is under the command of a Spanish Rear Admiral,
Jefe de la Base Naval de Rota, and certain areas of the base are strictly
for Spanish use. The Spanish consider the U.S. Naval Activities as
tenants and guests.

The status and authority of the Spanish Guardia Civil on Naval
Station Rota, is limited to the enforcement of Custom regulations as
defined in Spanish-American Procedural Agreements. In the capacity,
the Guardia Civil acts as agents for the Custom officials and has
confined its duties to the enforcement of custom regulations as they apply
to non-U.S. military ships / contract tankers, merchant vessels, etc./.
The Naval Station has unofficially been treated as a free zone for
visiting U.S. military ships, and no customs inspection or declarations
of personal effects brought ashore by U.S. military personnel have
been effected in the past. However, the Guardia Civil has established
check points at all points of egress from the station, at which all
personnel are subject to customs inspections. The Guardia Civil has
the power of any law enforcement agency to enforce the Spanish laws
and regulations, including the right of arrest of military personnel
off the base.



6. Specifically, all libertymen are instructed to comply with following set of rules:

- (2) To stay away from establishments where they obviously are not welcome.

- (5) To immediately call the shore patrol not only in an after-the-fact emergency but also when an "incident" appears to be developing.
- (6) To be moderate when drinking and to get their immoderate shipmates back as soon as possible.
- (7) To stay away from lonely areas (dark, deserted back streets, etc.)
- (8) To stay in the proper and complete uniform.
- (9) To be friendly and courteous.
- (10) To obey and cooperate with the Shore Patrol and others in authority.
- (11) To behave as men, not juveniles.
- (12) To keep away from local rallies, demonstrations, crowds, gangs, and gatherings.
- (13) To prevent over indulgence in alcoholic beverages which is definitely a major cause of improper behavior ashore. Shore Patrol has been instructed to immediately secure the liberty of personnel who have over indulged. Bringing disgrace to the uniform, service or the United States through drunkenness is a reportable offense.
- (14) To ensure they do not rent, buy, drive, or ride a motorscooter or motorcycle in any Med Port.
- (15) To ensure personnel take only two packs of cigarettes ashore. Anyone taking more than two packs ashore endangers himself for arrest for smuggling.
